

'The blast furnaces and coke ovens, with their hundreds of chimneys, planted obliquely, made lines of red flame... like giant torches.' In the flatlands of northern France lie the remnants of the coal-mining industry, made infamous by Emile Zola's *Germinal*. France's oldest-preserved mining estate, LA CITE DES ELECTRICIENS in Bruay-la-Buissière, will open to the public on 17 MAY. Rows of terraced houses constructed in 1856 for workers' families have been renovated by Philippe Prost, and the architects have also created a new purpose-built visitor's centre, clad in brilliant red glazed clay tiles, with the intention of educating the public about mining history. A changing roster of artists-in-residence will work on projects relating to the realm of raw coal in France, and an orchard and vegetable garden will provide quiet space in which to roam. Now a Unesco world heritage site, the revamped buildings offer a contemporary incarnation of the community. Sensitive to the memories of lives lived, it will ensure that the legacy of its old inhabitants is not forgotten. Details: citedeselectriciens.fr.
